Spa 6hrs Sounds of History

Don't know about you, but I like nothing more on a winters evening than to pour over a road atlas and plan my next trip in the XK8.



After one such evening a plan was hatched to go to the Spa 6hrs organised by the Belgium Historic Car Association (BEHVA) on the 30th September to the 3rd October 2021. The event itself is run over 4 days on the stunning Spa-Francorchamps circuit, There is racing throughout the day with several hundred historic cars competing. Culminating with the Six Hour endurance race featuring over 120 vehicles on the Saturday night. With

my 2001 XK8 freshly serviced and complete in the replica livery of the Stirling Moss XK Signature Edition we set off on the 29th September 2021 to Dover. Well that was the plan but it didn't take much convincing that from Leicester the M1,M25 and M20 was going to be pretty boring.

After a little bit of further planning it was decided that by leaving a little earlier we could stop off at the Brooklands Museum before catching the evening ferry from Dover.



Having never been to Brooklands before I hadn't realised how important the site was, being the first worlds purpose built racing circuit and later used for aircraft production and the development of Concorde, well worth a visit. Suitably replenish after a meal in their Sunbeam Cafe we headed off to Dover.

After the short ferry crossing from Dover we headed off to the Campernile Hotel in Calais for the night.

Those winter nights hadn't been wasted and having driven the rather dull Motorways in Northern France before a decision was made that we would break the journey that day and visit the Mahymobiles Museum (mahymobiles.be) which is conveniently situated just off the E42 Motorway our route to the Spa Francorchamp circuit.

A little about the museum, the collect consists of over 750 historical vehicles collected by the late Ghislain Mahy a Belgium industrialist, by 1997 the collection had out grown out of its previous location at Autoworld in Brussels. His son and the Mahy Foundation eventually found a suitable location and spent 2 1/2 years moving the collection to where it is now.

Our visit was all to short, it can only be described as stunning and really needs to be a separate trip in the future.

Leaving the Museum mid afternoon in glorious sunshine we quickly decided we'd had enough of the Motorway and turned off the E42 at Huy onto the N66 to drive the last 60 miles through the Ardenne Forest to Spa Francorchamps, climbing out of the town we selected sports mode on the box and used the J Gate gear selector for a spirited drive to our destination.

Accommodation around the circuit at this time of the year is plentiful, we stayed at a lodge in the Domaine long Pre holiday village just outside Stavelot. €215 for 3 nights

The following morning we were up early in time to see the first race at nine, the Masters pre 66 Touring Cars. There were 12 qualifying races during the day involving 750 cars culminating in the qualifying for the 6hr



endurance race. Somewhat tired after walking the 6 miles round the circuit we headed back to Stavelot where we enjoyed a nice Italian just off the towns Square.



Saturday after packing bags with waterproofs and camera batteries we were back off to the circuit for a full days racing, The Historic Touring car challenge and Tony Dron trophy, Historic GP Cars, Masters Endurance legends, Woodcote and Stirling Moss trophy, Masters Historic Formulae One and to end the day the Spa Six Hours endurance.

The Six hour got under way at 15.55hrs the leading class of Ford GT40s pulled away leading the rest of the field of assorted Jaguars, AC Cobras, Ford Falcons, Mini and Triumph Dolomites to mention just a few of the other makes to battle it out into the night. What a great race on a truly iconic circuit.



Sunday dawned a little cloudy and wet, after a leisurely start and a full English we headed back to the circuit for some more racing. The BEHVA are a very friendly bunch and put on a very good event, the main grandstand, pit and hospitality areas were all open and offer tremendous views of the circuit, we purchased an extremely good meal from the hot buffet for €16 before leaving the circuit at 15.00hrs.

Making sure we didn't emulate the race drivers we took a steady drive back to Calais for an overnight stop before catching the morning ferry back to Blighty.

Winter nights, atlas out somebody mentioned something about cars racing round the towns ramparts. Of course that would be the Circuit Des Remparts D' Angouleme France, don't mention it to the Jag!
