Jaguar Daimler Heritage Trust (JDHT)

The club was invited by the JDHT to attend a meeting, at the British Motor Museum at Gaydon.

There was a good attendance from the JBC, JEC, JDC, Daimler and Lanchester club, XJS club, Classic XK and E-type club. The only non-attendance was from the XKEC. There were three members of the JDHT, Mathew Davies (MD), Tony Merrygold (Collections Manager) and Maggy Haynes (Financial Director), and also Glen Kelly (JLR Classic).

After all introducing our clubs there was a big discussion on memberships. We are all having the same issues. Aging membership and how to engage younger members. Social media was said to be the way forward to engage a younger audience and even the JDHT are starting to look at Tik-Tok!

It was also mentioned that Jaguar are getting a bit more involved with the 100 celebrations. They still regard 1935 as the start of Jaguar but are celebrating the 100 anniversary as a "Founders" event. The JDHT tour which is going to have a drive around the Anglesey circuit on its way to Blackpool was originally intended to be a half day event. However the JEC are having a track day there now so it will be a whole day event. I have asked if spectators are allowed and they will get back to me.

The JLR parts manager gave a presentation and asked for comments and how they can help clubs. The main feedback to him was about pricing. But as they are "a business supplying quality products" prices are what they are. We also asked about ECM units. JLR are looking into it but he said Jaguar don't always have the information as firms, i.e. Bosch just supplied modules to do specific tasks as requested. Not knowing how they worked!! But Bosch do have a classic division that are looking into these modules. JLR Classic would like to know what parts members might need that are getting hard to find. The DLOC are even trying to get a machine out of a museum as it is the only one that can make certain parts for them.

The JDHT are also interested in getting Jaguar archive information and are looking at interviewing past employees for a "brain dump" They have also recruited an archive apprentice in the hope of cataloguing the archive and making it available digitally. They even have Sir William Lyon's papers archive but haven't read it all yet. They also said some of their archive is stored in the Cheshire salt mines.

There is another meeting in August. I found it quite useful and it keeps the clubs name at the forefront of Jaguar clubs.

Gareth & Denise Jones's 2nd article for the XKCC newsletter, on the Welsh Air Ambulance.

The Wales Air Ambulance Service launched on St. David's Day 1st March 2001. To keep the 4 Helicopters flying 24/7, we need to raise £8million pound every year. Current mission count since 2001: 40936. The Helicopters are based in: Caernarfon, Welshpool, Llanelli, Cardiff.

The Cardiff Helicopter is the "Children's Wales Air Ambulance".



The Welsh Flying Medics.

The Wales Air Ambulance Charity has a unique partnership with NHS Wales, which enables NHS doctors and practitioners to fly on board its aircraft.

This means patients can receive advanced treatments and care before reaching hospital.

Through the scheme, 24 consultants and 18 critical care practitioners fly with Wales Air Ambulance on a fully rostered programme from the NHS' "Emergency Medical Retrieval & Transfer Service". The partnership also provides access to a range of sophisticated equipment and a fleet of rapid response cars, which are used on missions where appropriate (such as poor weather for flying).

The consultants are the same as you would see in an A & E hospital, flying to you. The CCPs are highly skilled in critical care, from nursing and paramedic backgrounds. The teams use some of the most advanced treatments and equipment in the world, from techniques developed in the armed forces.

The "Welsh Flying Medics" was the first dedicated, consultant-led air ambulance operation in the UK. The scheme is committed not only to providing the most advanced pre-hospital care in Wales, but also in upskilling and attracting doctors and CCPs to the operation.



This was an event we attended at the Saltney Christmas Fair.
